SUBJECT: STROBE LIGHT AND POINT CHECKER

Strobe Light

A Strobe Light is used to determine whether or not the Ignition Spark Timing is set accurately. The instructions on the use of the Strobe Light is explained and illustrated on Page 29 in the "Timing The Spark" Instruction Booklet.

There are several types and makes of Strobe Lights available at local Automotive Equipment Stores.

We use and recommend the Marquette Strobe Light No. 41-117 supplied by Marquette, 5075 Wayzata Blvd., Minneapolis, Minnesota.

Point Checker

A Point Checker is used to determine the exact instant the contact points open when you assemble and adjust the auto advance unit taper into the valve cam gear spindle, also when you "Time the Ignition."

Point Checkers Are available at Electrical Equipment Supply Stores and Automotive Equipment Supply Stores. We use and recommend a Point Checker manufactured by OKUDA KOKI CO., LTD., Model P.C. No. 1711 supplied by Yamaha International, U. S. Route 30 Belle Lane, Downingtown, Pa.

You must have these two pieces of Equipment to do an accurate job of Timing the Twin Engines, therefore, we urge you to purchase them right away.
